If you have read our summer book, The Chocolate Chip Cookie Murder, please join us for a chat about your favorite character, favorite part of plot, or your favorite recipe in book.


Please let me know & I will send you the Zoom link for Monday, September 15 at 6:30.




November: I will show you a demo of how to make Norwegian brown cheese and will bring some to the meeting!

- ◆ NBC King Penguin: Norway has a tradition of knighting a king penguin named Sir Olav, made both a mascot and an honorary member of the Norwegian King's Guard after the battalion visited the Edinburgh Zoo
- Geothermically Heated Sidewalks: Some sidewalks in the capital city of Reykjavík are heated geothermically in the winter
- ◆ Located far above the Arctic Circle in Finnmark, the <u>rock art of Alta</u> (at right) is the largest known collection of prehistoric carvings in Northern Europe. More than 6,000 individual figures have been discovered, some dating back as far as 4200 BC.





• A French Army officer became a Scandinavian King. Jean Baptiste Bernadotte began his life as the son of a French lawyer, rising through the ranks of Napoleon's army to become a general. he was offered the Swedish throne after the death of a crown prince and a series of dynastic complications. He accepted, converted to Lutheranism, learned Swedish (sort of), and ruled as King Karl XIV Johan. His descendants still sit on the Swedish throne today.
